## Queensland Intensive Care Training Pathway

The Queensland intensive care training pathway provides centralised selection and allocation of intensive care medicine trainees to accredited adult and paediatric intensive care units statewide. Trainees are appointed to a pathway training hospital for 6 or 12 months. Trainees remain on the pathway for the duration of their intensive care training, subject to satisfactory performance.

## Eligibility

The eligibility criteria for new applicants are:

- General or Limited registration with the Medical Board of Australia
- Registration with the College of Intensive Care Medicine of Australia and New Zealand (CICM) or eligible to register after completing six months experience in a CICM accredited unit
- two years or more postgraduate clinical experience (preferably with some experience in critical care medicine).

## How to apply

If you meet the above eligibility criteria and are seeking an intensive care registrar position in Queensland in 2017 you should apply for a pathway position via the RMO Campaign application website at <http://www.health.qld.gov.au/rmo>

Applications open on 8 June and close on 6 July 2016.
