



Overseas Aid Committee Trainee/New Fellow Grant

Grant Application Guidelines

This grant was developed by the CICM Overseas Aid Committee and its purpose is to provide a trainee or new Fellow with valuable learning opportunities and provide critical care assistance in a low income country or region. Successful applications must promote fairness, equality and sustainability in the unit.

Value: Up to \$AU 12 500

A maximum of two grants will be awarded in any one year

Eligibility: CICM trainees and Fellows within one year of Fellowship.

Conditions: A CICM Fellow must be working in the unit/organisation.

All insurance and registration requirements must be covered by either the trainee or hospital where work will be undertaken.

Duration: Positions will be funded for a minimum term of 3 months.

Closing Date: TBC

Successful applications must adhere to the following principles;

- Provide critical care assistance in an area of need
- The trainee/new Fellow should receive valuable learning opportunities in intensive care
- Maximise cost benefit
- Promote sustainability in the unit where they work

Funding may be used for the following:

(Approval for reimbursement for any other items must be sought from the Committee and is not guaranteed.)

- Flights
- Accommodation
- Moving Costs
- Meals
- Police Checks
- Phone/Internet Charges
- Transport ó public transport/taxis

Grant applications will be assessed by an assessment panel consisting of the Overseas Aid Committee, a Fellow representative, a trainee representative and the Fellowship Affairs Manager

The usual prospective approval process must be followed if the trainee wishes any of the time to be assessed for training and there is no guarantee that the time will be accredited. A final report will be due at the end of the project and the successful applicants will be expected to submit an article to the College e-news about their experiences.
